# TOUR ITINERARY

## DAY 1

Destination	Perth 🚗 Cervantes
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ Cervantes Pinnacles Motel, or similar

Today, pick up your vehicle from the local car hire office and depart the city of Perth and travel north along the Indian Ocean Drive to the coastal town of Cervantes and one of Australia's most unique landscapes, the Pinnacles Desert. Cervantes has a number of pristine beaches, within easy walking distance of the town centre, ideal for swimming, boating and windsurfing.

## DAY 2

Destination	Cervantes 🚗 Geraldton
Meals included	
Hotel	3 ★ Ibis Styles Geraldton, or similar

When in Geraldton take some time to visit the Byzantine style St. Xavier Cathedral and the Geraldton Museum, which houses relics from the numerous ships wrecked along this coastline. Geraldton has beautiful beaches, excellent fishing and enticing restaurants.

Suggested Activity: Visit the HMAS Sydney memorial. The Memorial was dedicated on the 18th November 2001 and the Eternal Flame was lit on the 19th November 2001, 60 years to the day after the tragic loss.

## DAY 3

Destination	Geraldton 🚗 Kalbarri
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ Kalbarri Edge Resorts, or similar

Today you will continue onto Kalbarri, located on the midwest coast. With its pristine beaches and towering coastal cliffs, Kalbarri is a treat for visitors. Once you arrive in Kalbarri let the experiences unwind. You can do everything from abseiling, horse riding, windsurfing or you can simply take time to absorb the wonderful surrounds.

Suggested Activity: A visit to Hutt Lagoon is a must. Hutt Lagoon is a salt lake with a pink hue due to the presence of the carotenoid producing algae, Dunaliella salina, which is a source of beta-carotene, used as a food-colouring agent and source of Vit A. in cosmetics and supplements. The lagoon contains the worlds largest microalgae production plant.

## DAY 4

Destination	Kalbarri
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ Kalbarri Edge Resorts, or similar

Today, see Kalbarri & its spectacular Coastal Cliffs from the Air! Since much of the Kalbarri Coastal region's most pleasing scenery is inaccessible by road, our flights offer you the opportunity to witness the wonders of the Mid West at first hand from the best possible vantage point - the air! Taking off from Kalbarri Airport, we fly towards the town and low along the beachfront before heading at cliff top height past the coastal cliffs with their lovely red sedimentary rock colours. On past the surfing beach, we reach Red Bluff, Rainbow Gorge and a series of connecting gorges before returning, past the cliffs and low over the Kalbarri beach strip back to the airport.

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### DAY 5

Destination	Kalbarri 🚗 Monkey Mia
Meals included	
Hotel	3 ★ Monkey Mia Dolphin Resort Shark Bay, or similar

Depart Kalbarri and continue north towards Denham and Monkey Mia. Monkey Mia is famous for its Dolphins, beautiful scenery and sparkling blue waters providing spectacular photographic opportunities. These are wild animals that after years of care and understanding come in to be fed of their own accord by the rangers.

### DAY 6

Destination	Monkey Mia 🚗 Carnarvon
Meals included	
Hotel	3 ★ Hospitality Inn Carnarvon, or similar

Famous for its banana plantations, Carnarvon on Australia's Coral Coast is the southern gateway to the world-famous Ningaloo Reef and provides the ideal base for exploring Mount Augustus and the Kennedy Ranges to the east and coastal stations to the north.

### DAY 7

Destination	Carnarvon 🚗 Coral Bay
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ Ningaloo Coral Bay Resort, or similar

Today you will travel onto Coral Bay, a small holiday resort offering wonderful sandy beaches suitable for swimming. It is situated at the start of the Ningaloo Marine Park, which continues north along the North West Cape. Coral Bay is a good place for snorkelling offering a host of coral and underwater delights.

Suggested Activity: Close encounters of the marine kind can be enjoyed year-round, including spotting or swimming with graceful manta rays, dugongs and turtles. Or take to the skies on a scenic flight and drink in the spectacle from above.

### DAY 8

Destination	Coral Bay
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ Ningaloo Coral Bay Resort, or similar

Today is at leisure for you to explore the Coral Bay region. Nature lovers should note that this is one of the best places in the world to see whale sharks and manta rays. If you are travelling between June and October you may even witness the humpback whale migration.

Suggested Activity: If you are in Coral Bay between March and September, you can't leave Coral Bay without swimming with the majestic whale sharks. There are numerous operators offering whale shark experiences, so visit the Coral Bay Visitor Centre or speak to your hotel concierge to book. If the whale sharks aren't in town, spend the day on one of many snorkelling tours or simply walk off the white sand into the Ningaloo Marine Park.

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### DAY 9

Destination	Coral Bay 🚗 Tom Price
Meals included	
Hotel	2 ★ Tom Price Motel, or similar

Depart Coral Bay for Karijini National Park, Western Australia's second largest park. Explore ancient rocky tunnels and plunging gorges, paddle through crystal-clear waterways and swim under stunning waterfalls.

### DAY 10

Destination	Tom Price
Meals included	
Hotel	2 ★ Tom Price Motel, or similar

Today is at leisure for you to explore the Karijini National Park.

Suggested Activity: Karjini National Park is known for its crystal clear - and croc free - swimming holes. Within Dale's Gorge on the eastern side of the park, the swimming hole at Fortescue Falls one of the best on offer in the park. From the carpark, it will take about an hour to walk down a staircase and along clear paths to the falls. You can also swim nearby in the refreshing, spring-fed Fern Pool, or tackle the two-hour return hike to picturesque Circular Pool, at the gorge's other end.

### DAY 11

Meals included	
Hotel	3 ★ Hospitality Inn Port Hedland, or similar

Depart Karijini National Park and continue onto Port Hedland, the gateway for Australia's massive iron ore exports from the surrounding Pilbara region.

### DAY 12

Destination	Port Hedland 🚗 Broome
Meals included	
Hotel	4 ★ The Oaks Cable Beach, or similar

An early start is recommended today for the drive through to Broome via the Great Northern Highway. Pristine beaches and bays fringed with glistening white sands, craggy red cliffs and the sparkling tropical waters of the Indian Ocean are some of the wonders of this coastal delight.

### DAY 13

Destination	Broome 🚗 Dampier Peninsula
Meals included	Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Cygnets Bay Safari Camp (Permanent Tent), or similar

The Dampier Peninsula is an extraordinary blend of pristine beaches and dramatic coastlines, rich in traditional Aboriginal culture. Travelling north, learn about the region's fascinating history from our guided commentary. Our first

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stop is the Beagle Bay Aboriginal Community, home of the Beagle Bay Church with its glimmering pearl shell altar, for morning tea. Soon we arrive at the One Arm Point Community, perched on the tip of the Dampier Peninsula, to visit the Community's aquaculture hatchery, complete with barramundi, pearl and trochus shell. After a picnic lunch we head for the remote Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm. In 1946 Dean Brown skippered a rickety wooden lugger into an unknown frontier to discover this hidden paradise: his descendants continue to operate what is now the oldest Pearl Farm in Australia. Embark an extraordinary cruise through the Islands of the Giant Tides to experience the remarkable tidal flows of King Sound. In the evening we relax round a fire in our own private camp

### DAY 14

Destination	Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm 🚢 Kooljaman 🚢 Cape Leveque & Broome
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	4 ★ The Oaks Broome, or similar

This morning a knowledgeable local guide will demonstrate a pearl harvest, providing a glimpse into this fully operational pearl farm. Discover how they cultivate some of the most sought after and beautiful pearls in the world and enjoy an in-depth pearl grading and appreciation session that will leave you feeling like a pearl expert! Mid morning we depart for beautiful Kooljaman at Cape Leveque. You may like to head off for a swim, or take one of the lovely walks in the area to explore the rugged red coastline for which Cape Leveque is famous. Driving back through the dusk, keep an eye out for wildlife before arriving in Broome.

### DAY 15

Destination	Broome 🚢 Tunnel Creek
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Lake Argyle and the Fitzroy River Lodge (Dome Tents), or similar

As we travel through the remote and beautiful Kimberley landscape, our guide shares stories of local history, people and the environment. Enjoy a morning tea break by the Fitzroy River and visit the Derby 'Boab Prison Tree' before we hit the Gibb River Road. Visit the fascinating Mowanjum Aboriginal Art & Cultural Centre for an insight into the culture of the Worrorra, Ngarinyin and Wunumbal tribes and their supreme spirit being, the Wandjina. The afternoon is devoted to exploring Tunnel Creek, with our local Bunuba guide. In this 750-metre cave system carved through the Napier Range, we discover stalactites, secret caves and a large variety of wildlife. It is here we also learn the legend of Jandamarra, an Aboriginal freedom fighter who used the tunnel as a hide-out in the late 1800's. Don't miss a refreshing swim in an idyllic waterhole. That night we settle into our first night under the Kimberley night sky.

### DAY 16

Destination	Tunnel Creek 🚢 West Kimberley Gorges
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Private safari camp at Manning Gorge (Permanent Tents), or similar

The Napier Range is over 350 million years old and home to the geological wonder of Windjana Gorge. Beneath gorge walls rising 90m, we spend the morning searching for freshwater crocodiles, local birdlife and indigenous bush tucker. In the afternoon we head off to Dalmanyi ( Bell Gorge), a hidden highlight of the West Kimberley. This idyllic retreat, considered amongst the most beautiful in the area, boasts cascading waterfalls and crystal clear pools formed over millions of years – an easy place to while away a few hours! Spend the next day swimming in paradise: further up the Gibb River Road, we discover the cool waters of water lily-laden Galvans Gorge and stunning Adcock Gorge. Amid the rugged beauty of Manning Falls we swim in deep clear waters, relax, explore wandering streams, uncover local wildlife and take a dip in the waterfall pools. Overnight we camp by a billabong on Mt Barnett Cattle Station.

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### DAY 17

Destination	West Kimberley Gorges
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Private safari camp at Manning Gorge (Permanent Tents), or similar

Spend another day exploring this incredible remote wilderness chasing waterfalls and waterholes with your guide.

### DAY 18

Destination	West Kimberley Gorges 🚗 El Questro Wilderness Park
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Private safari camp at El Questro Station (Permanent Tents), or similar

Our journey up the Gibb River Road continues to the iconic El Questro Wilderness Park. Two nights in our private campsite here allows free time join one or more of the many activities on offer. We include a refreshing dip in the Zebedee Springs and walk into Emma Gorge while a cruise on Chamberlain Gorge, bush tucker walk or bird watching tour are amongst the many optional activities. You may choose to simply explore this beautiful wilderness park at your own leisure.

### DAY 19

Destination	El Questro Wilderness Park
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Private safari camp at El Questro Station (Permanent Tents), or similar

Spend another day exploring this incredible wilderness park with your guide.

### DAY 20

Destination	El Questro Wilderness Park 🚗 Kununurra 🚗 Lake Argyle
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Lake Argyle Resort Standard Room (private ensuite), or similar

We emerge from the Gibb River Road for a few hours free time in Kununurra. In the afternoon, travel onto the shores of the expansive Lake Argyle, the heart of the Ord River Irrigation System which has transformed this dry region into a lush agricultural oasis. There is free time to join a sunset boat cruise on the lake (approx AU\$100pp, own expense), visit the historic Durack Homestead Museum or take on one of the many bush trails to explore the area.

### DAY 21

Destination	Lake Argyle 🚗 Purnululu National Park (Bungle Bungles)
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Bungle Bungles Safari Camp (Permanent Tents), or similar

After a leisurely morning, head south down the Great Northern Highway to Purnululu National Park, home of the magnificent Bungle Bungles. Two nights here, staying in our new private Bungle Bungle Safari Camp in the heart of the Park, allows a full day to explore the highlights of this extraordinary National Park, the most famous of which, are

the Bungle Bungle domes. Rivers created this landscape of unique orange and black striped 'beehive' geological formations over a period of 20 million years. Unbelievably, only the locals knew it existed until the early 1980's; once discovered by others, the area was made a national park in 1987. We explore Echidna Chasm (2km), known for its towering Livistonia Palm trees, and take a short walk (2-3km) into stunning Cathedral Gorge, where towering rocks create a natural amphitheatre. There is time in the afternoon to take an optional scenic helicopter flight and enjoy a birds-eye view of the beehive domes (approx \$450pp, own expense, payable on tour) to put it all into perspective.

### DAY 22

Destination	Purnululu National Park
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	Bungle Bungles Safari Camp (Permanent Tents), or similar

Spend another day in this incredible national park with your guide.

### DAY 23

Destination	Purnululu National Park 🚗 Fitzroy Crossing
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	The Safari Cabins at the Fitzroy River Lodge (private ensuite), or similar

Enroute to Fitzroy Crossing, we break the long journey with a visit the gold rush town of Halls Creek to see the remarkable China Wall. We also enjoy lunch at Marys Pool and visit the remote Laarri Aboriginal Art Gallery, before an evening by the Fitzroy River at Fitzroy Crossing.

### DAY 24

Destination	Fitzroy Crossing 🚗 Geikie Gorge 🚗 Broome
Meals included	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Hotel	4 ★ The Oaks Broome, or similar

A morning cruise through the majestic Danggu (Geikie Gorge) is a great start to our last day. Nature carved this wonder through the Geikie and Oscar Ranges during the Devonian geological period. Learn of the fascinating geology of this natural wonder and discover the huge array of wildlife including freshwater crocodiles, birds and fish. Explore Old Fitzroy Crossing and enjoy lunch by the river before we return to Broome in time to enjoy the sunset on Cable Beach.

### VEHICLES, CAMPING & PACKING INFORMATION

#### **Vehicles**

These tours are operated in custom-built, 21-24 seat 4WD trucks with a PA system, wide viewing windows and built-in storage (no risky trailers!). These vehicles allow our small groups extra space (including standing room), are fully air-conditioned and, for your comfort are fitted with adjustable air-vents, reclinable seats, map pockets and footrests. Note that some Broome Day Tours may operate in larger 24-seat 4WD trucks.

#### **Permanent Tents**

For those nights when you are staying in National Parks and not one of our own Private Wilderness Camps, we provide tents, swags (including 2 – 3 inch mattresses), bottom sheets, pillows and pillow cases. All campsites have shared ablution facilities.

Overnight campsites are well equipped with ablutions facilities – with flushing toilets and hot showers – including our private Bungle Bungles Safari Camp in Purnululu National Park.

#### **What to pack**

- A broad-brimmed sun hat
- Good walking boots or sturdy shoes for hiking over rocky terrain
- Fitted shoes for walking in water
- Torch (a head torch is ideal)
- Swimmers & towel
- Personal water bottle (1 Litre recommended)
- Sunscreen

- Towels – shower and swimming

As a general rule, portorage is not included, therefore at all times you are expected to handle your own luggage where help may not be available.

This particular tour is categorised as a "3".

3 – Moderate Tour: A good level of fitness and mobility is required, as this tour includes a moderate level of physical activity and is considered a medium-fast paced tour. You should be able to walk up and down stairs and able to walk reasonable distances of approximately 2 kilometres per day or more with ease. Any physical ailments you may have must be disclosed at the time of booking to determine your suitability.
